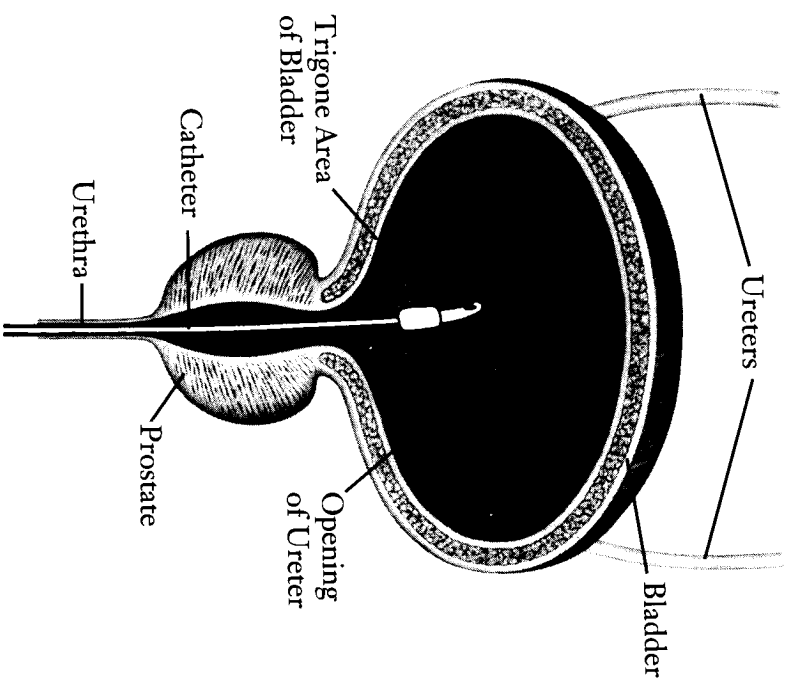

## Instillation of BCG into the Bladder

You are about to receive medication into your bladder.

This is done by inserting a catheter into the opening of the urethra, then into the bladder. When the catheter is in the bladder, medication (BCG) will be passed through the catheter into the bladder. This is called a bladder instillation. You will receive your BCG treatment via this method.

The usual course of treatment is once a week for six (6) weeks or \_\_\_\_\_ as directed by your physician.

### Before Instillation

- ✔ Please be on time for your instillation treatment.
- ✔ Do not drink fluids for at least four (4) hours before you receive your treatment.
- ✔ Inform your doctor if you have felt feverish, tired or had chills since your last treatment or if you have been urinating any bright red blood before your instillation.
- ✔ Empty your bladder just before the instillation.
